I can confirm I am the Consultant Neurologist that looked after this patient. She has a severe neurological illness in which she has recurrent episodes of optic neuritis causing blindness, and spinal transverse myelitis causing weakness in her legs and bladder dysfunction.

She came to England for further investigations and it was necessary for her to have these all during her period of admission, which included an MRI scan of her brain and whole spinal cord, evoked potentials from her eyes, ears arms and legs, lumbar puncture examination, blood tests and physiotherapy assessment.

In addition it was essential for her to have serology to check for the Aquaporin antibodies which we know can sometimes cause the associated optic neuritis with transverse myelitis. This blood test was done while she was in England and has turned out to be positive, and this is extremely helpful in managing her condition further with immunosuppressive therapy.
